## Vice Commodore's Corner

PHRF #5 on May 7th was the week after the Stephen C. Smith Memorial Regatta. Five boats checked in for the A-fleet and *Fellowship* plus *WaterGeus* represented the B-fleet. As the wind was forecast to change during the afternoon, a somewhat unusual course was set: Center-West-

North-West-Center, for both fleets. There was a good WNW breeze over 10 knots at the start, so *Harmony* decided to not race that day. After the first leg, the wind quickly went down in strength and went towards the SW. *Wiki Wiki* and *Sigismunda* were close at the front of the fleet and *Staccato* and *WaterGeus* were close, spending a good bit of a mile close enough to hand over some Grey Poupon, had we had any. By the finish, *Sigismunda* took line honors and *Wiki Wiki* won on handicap. *Staccato* finished ahead of *Allegro*. *WaterGeus* finished ahead of *Fellowship* and also did well on handicap compared to the A-fleet.

PHRF #6 on May 21st looked like it might have been the first day of the PHRF season with a chance of rain and a thunderstorm risk, but the unpleasant stuff went through early enough to leave a nice day for sailing. Attendance was light with *Wiki Wiki* for the A-fleet and *WaterGeus* and *Prone Ranger* in the B-fleet. The wind started slightly North of West and quite light too, so a course of Center-West-Center was set. *Wiki Wiki* had the best start, followed by *Prone Ranger* and *WaterGeus*. A wind change rolled in from the East, with increasing strength and a shift towards South, favoring the

boats in the rear and making the return leg a beam reach. *Wiki Wiki* finished first with *WaterGeus* following close enough to be ahead on handicap had they sailed in the same fleet. The crew on *Prone Ranger* was the only one with a chance to catch fish on the race course, having brought their fishing gear, and they used that opportunity to the max. There was plenty of time left in the day, so a second race was held on a North-Center-North course in a good sea breeze and a proper Windward-Leeward course. *WikiWiki* with a full crew of four was now in her element against the previously favored light crew of two on *WaterGeus* and finished well ahead, with the crew on *Prone Ranger* a smiling third.

As we now have 6 completed races in the 2016 Spring Series, the two worst scores for each boat will be thrown out. The June make-up day will not be used.

We found the switch for the parking area floodlights; it is one of three hidden behind the trophy case. During the upcoming construction we will get these relocated so they are usable or alternatively, find a new location for the trophy case.

We have nocturnal visitors to the trash bins, so please refrain from putting any garbage bags on top of the hampers that are full. We have three hampers so move to the next one when one gets filled. Even a small amount of overflow allows raccoons to get under the lid and pick it up.

Our seawall is eroded in multiple spots at the canal bottom margin and will have to be placed on the priority list or we will face an even more expensive repair later. Two contractors have both indicated we could use vinyl panels outside the existing wood and fasten it to the existing tie backs if we don't let the damage get much worse. The Board discussed this in meetings last year and it will be placed on our agenda again.

## HINTS & NOTES FROM NEAR & FAR

OK, it is the start of hurricane season. Other than the flooding from Dennis, we have not had a close call since Kate. However, close can cause a lot of damage. It would be a good idea to review the Club's Storm Plan (on the web) as well as to consider preparing your boat (coastal home) just in case. When I had a boat at the float at Shell Point, I had an extra set of "hurricane lines" and separate floating attachments to the pilings. I also pulled all the electronics and "spare gear".

Some people recommend the 3-line rule. You have a main dock lines set, you have a second set of lines secured, and then there is the third set. The second and third sets of lines are a bit looser than the first set. The idea is that if a line in the first set fails, the next line will take up the strain, and so forth. You do have suitable backing plates on all your cleats?

Of course, no matter what you do, you may still lose or have a damaged boat. Before Kate, I moved our Sisu 22 to a float in Paradise Village that was available because the owner had pulled his boat and taken it back to town. My boat came through fine. He had a tree fall on his boat in the backyard in Tallahassee.
