

ABYC BOARD MEETING Draft Minutes

Please be aware that the minutes upon which this draft is based have not been approved by the Board. Every effort has been made to ensure accuracy, but errors may inadvertently be present.

Commodore Scott Robinson called the Board meeting of the Apalachee Bay Yacht Club to order at 1535 on Saturday, November 1, 2014 at the ABYC clubhouse.

Present: Scott Robinson, Steve LaRosa, Ed Fries, Ivor Groves, Camden Whitlock, Martha Robinson, and Maxie Glenn. Dede Wells was absent.

Commodore-Scott Robinson

Presented a request from Ted Gaupin regarding the last two slips on the docks. Ted claims that the Club owns about 6 feet beyond the second to the last finger. The Wakulla County Property Appraiser's website has a map with property boundaries. In the absence of a survey, a conclusion cannot be determined. Scott will attempt to find an existing survey or request a new one be done.

The Board members agreed to add language to the slip agreements that slip assignments are subject to change at the discretion of the Rear Commodore. A notice will be included in the next issue of *The Mark*.

Vice Commodore-Steve LaRosa

Shared a 2.5-minute video of Melanie Simmons and her children sailing *Kestral* for a VisitFlorida video, entitled "Set Sail at Shell Point".

The joint board planning meeting will be held January 3, 2015, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Rear Commodore-Ed Fries

Ed discussed the prices for a new dishwasher/sanitizer. It was moved and seconded that ABYC purchase a dishwasher/sanitizer,

pending the budget discussion, up to \$5,000. The motion carried.

Other projects and needed repairs will be addressed at a workday on Nov. 15, 10 a.m.

Past Commodore-Ivor Groves

Discussed member recruiting efforts. He volunteered to help the Club conduct a series of growth management sessions to guide the growth of the Club. The Board members present agreed.

Jorge and Joanna Mateo were approved as new members of the Club.

Purser-Maxie Glenn

The monthly financial report was reviewed and approved by the Board, and a copy was filed at the ABYC clubhouse for review by members. Four associate members did not become Regular members. After discussion, it was agreed that Maxie will prepare a summary of how she handles the Reserve accounts. It was also agreed that she will consult with Tony Cleveland regarding the Club's insurance policy.

It was agreed that Maxie will introduce a system to allow Board members to authorize drinks for prospective members during Club events, when the bar is open. Maxie will also contact Club members to inquire about adding information for minor children to the membership directory.

It was agreed that the combination will be changed by January 3, so that all members can be notified in the billing on January 4.

HINTS & NOTES FROM NEAR & FAR*C. Henry Depew*

The *Federal Register*, dated Monday Sept 22, 2014, noted that the USCG will change the life jacket type labels to be the same as International and Canadian standards. Type 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 will be eliminated and only the terms Wearable And Throwable will be used. There are 66 life jacket companies and it will take time for them to modify their labels. Effective Wednesday, October 22, 2014.

Also of note is that the USCG *Navigation Rules International-Inland* (M16672.2D) has a new edition. When there are so many changes, the USCG comes out with another edition. The USCG will no longer print copies to sell, but aftermarket companies will. To access it and print your own go to www.uscg.mil.


time.
